


## Do I Own My Data?

Let's get some clarity about the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) and Patient Rights to Their Data.

Your Health Data Rights (edited excerpt from a Citizen blog post written by Deven McGraw):

- With a few exceptions..., you have the right to all of your health information from your medical providers and your health plans.
- You have the right to an electronic copy of any information that is maintained electronically...
- You have the right to get your health information sent to your e-mail – even if your e-mail isn't secure, as long as you acknowledge that you are comfortable with receiving your health information this way.
